Bio:

Anne Dushanko Dobek is an installation artist whose works focus on issues of social justice and the environment.

A three time recipient of New Jersey Council for the Arts Fellowships, most recently in 2012, she has also been supported by fellowships from the Puffin Foundation, Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, and Earthwatch.

Dushanko Dobek has a Bachelors degree from Rowan University, a Masters Degree from Pratt institute and studies at the New School, the School of Visual Arts and Robert Blackburn studios.

A frequent lecturer on issues related to both art and the environment;. Dushanko Dobek has given presentations are the Musee Cantonal des Beaux Arts in Switzerland, the Newark Museum, Montclair Art Museums Rutgers, University, the University of Kentucky in Lexington and the Lepidopterists Convention.

Dushanko Dobek has exhibited extensively in the United States and Europe including the Gulbenkian Foundation Brussels, Musee Cantonal des Beaux Arts in Lausanne, Switzerland, the Museum of Arts and Design in New York, and the High Museum in Atlanta. Her works are in the collections of the Dallas Museum of Art, the Museum of Modern Art, the Library of the Victoria and Albert Museum, and the Montclair Museum of Art.

Fellowships at The Vermont Studio Center, I-park, Long Beach Island Foundation and the Virginia Center for the Creative Arts have allowed her to create some of her more ambitious outdoor installations. These have been seen at Seton Hall University in 2010, the Pen and Brush Club in New York in 2009 and I-Park in 2007 and 2008.
